

“For me, it’s, I feel the way things are going, you know, we’re finally getting H-2B workers coming in the next week, about 50 of them, and you’re going to see this constant wave of workers coming in—thank you Mr. President, because, again, we’re seeing this loosening of, hopefully, our labor shortage,” said Calvo. “But I also see a president that is focusing on what’s good for the economy of the United States. And what’s good for the economy of the United States also is good for the economy of Guam.”

Guam is still waiting for the arrival of nearly a thousand more H-2B workers who were also approved under the NDAA exemption for military construction projects.
