Workforce Investment Act of 1998
Title I Chapter V
Dislocated Worker Eligibility Requirements

Sec. 101(9) Dislocated worker --The term "dislocated worker" means an individual who:

Sec. 101(9)(A):

Sec. 101(9)(A)(i) has been terminated or laid off, or who has received a notice of termination or layoff, from employment;

Sec. 101(9)(A)(ii) (I) is eligible for or has exhausted entitlement to unemployment compensation; or

Sec. 101(9)(A)(ii) (II) has been employed for a duration sufficient to demonstrate, to the appropriate entity at a one-stop center referred to in section 134(c), attachment to the workforce, but is not eligible for unemployment compensation due to insufficient earnings or having performed services for an employer that were not covered under a State unemployment compensation law; and

Sec. 101(9)(A)(iii) is unlikely to return to a previous industry or occupation;

Sec. 101(9)(B):

Sec. 101(9)(B) (i) has been terminated or laid off, or has received a notice of termination or layoff, from employment as a result of any permanent closure of, or any substantial layoff at, a plant, facility, or enterprise;

Sec. 101(9)(B)(ii) is employed at a facility at which the employer has made a general announcement that such facility will close within 180 days; or

Sec. 101(9)(B)(iii) for purposes of eligibility to receive services other than training services described in section 134(d)(4), intensive services described in section 134(d)(3), or supportive services, is employed at a facility at which the employer has made a general announcement that such facility will close;

Sec. 101(9)(C) was self-employed (including employment as a farmer, a rancher, or a fisherman) but is unemployed as a result of general economic conditions in the community in which the individual resides or because of natural disasters; or

Sec. 101(9)(D) is a Displaced Homemaker.

Sec. 101(10)

Displaced Homemaker-- The term "displaced homemaker" means an individual who has been providing unpaid services to family members in the home and who:

Sec. 101(10)(A) has been dependent on the income of another family member but is no longer supported by that income; and

Sec. 101(10)(B) is unemployed or underemployed and is experiencing difficulty in obtaining or upgrading employment.
