GUAM WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 08-03

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT A METHODOLOGY TO DISTRIBUTE COSTS OF THE GUAM ONE-STOP CAREER CENTER

WHEREAS, the One-Stop Career Center (OSCC) presents an opportunity to better prepare our customers to adopt to the workforce and economic development requirements of the 21st Century;

WHEREAS, under the Workforce Investment Act of 1998, the One-Stop Career Center is not a direct recipient of state or federal awards. Rather, it is the location through which several workforce development and education programs operate their programs in partnership with other entities and make services available to the program beneficiaries such as participants, students, the unemployed, job seekers, employers and incumbent workers;

WHEREAS, the Guam Department of Labor is the designated Operator of the One-Stop Career Center;

WHEREAS, the Guam Workforce Investment Board (GWIB) has the authority to negotiate terms with One-Stop partners in determining how to share costs, as long as the basis (method) for cost sharing is compatible with the governing provisions of WIA, other partner's legislation, grant agreements and Office of Management Budget (OMB) Circulars;

WHEREAS, the Cost Allocation Plan is an addendum to the One-Stop Career Center Memorandum of Understanding between partners and describes the method of allocating costs based on generally accepted accounting principles between partners of the One-Stop Center;

WHEREAS, the required partner programs mandated to participate are (1) The Agency for Human Resources Development (AHRD) – Title I of WIA (Adult, Youth, Dislocated Worker); (2) The Guam Department of Labor – Wagner-Peyser; Senior Community Service Employment Program, Workforce Information (Core Products); (3) The Department of Integrated Services, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation – Title IV of WIA Vocational Rehabilitation Support Services Program; (4) The Department of Public Health and Social Services – Food Stamps Program; MCH Block Grant Program; Child Care & Development Fund; (5) The Guam Housing & Urban Renewal – Family Self Sufficiency and Workforce Related Programs; (6) The Guam Public School System – Pacific Vocational Education Improvement Program (PVEIP); and (7) The Guam Community College – WIA Title II, Adult Education & Literacy; Post Secondary Vocational Education under the Carl Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Act;
