

Almost \$1 billion worth of military projects approved for Guam

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Almost a billion dollars worth of military construction projects has been approved the Department of Defense.

A combined \$990,000,000 multiple-award, design-build construction contract for located primarily for sites in Guam and other areas within the Naval Facilities Eng Command (NAVFAC) were awarded by the defense department.

The contractors who were given the project are Black Construction-Tutor Perini Harmon, Guam; Caddell-Nan JV, Montgomery based in Alabama; Core Tech-HDC LLC, based in Tamuning, Guam; Gilbane SMCC ECC LLC, based in Concord, Calif Hensel Phelps Construction Co., based in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Gilbane SMCC ECC LLC is being awarded the initial \$22,997,004 task order for t and construction of a low rise combined dining and high-intensity tactical training the aviation combat element at Andersen Air Force Base, Joint Region Marianas,

The work to be performed provides new construction, renovation and minor cons may include but is not limited to: barracks/dormitories; administrative facilities; cc facilities; educational facilities; medical/dental/hospital facilities; dining facilities; in facilities; warehouse facilities; ranges; operational/training facilities; roads, streets

site utilities/infrastructure; dredging, and aviation facilities (including hangars and other base development facilities.

Work for this task order is expected to be completed by April 2022. All work on t will be performed primarily within the NAVFAC Pacific AOR, which includes Guan Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (10%); Hawaii (5%); and other are Pacific and Indian Oceans (5%).

The term of the contract is not to exceed 60 months with an expected completio 2024. Fiscal 2015 and 2019 military construction (Navy) contract funds for \$22,99 obligated on this award, of which \$13,615,340 will expire at the end of the curren

This contract was competitively procured via the Navy Electronic Commerce Onli with eight proposals received.

According to DOD, these five contractors may compete for task orders under the conditions of the awarded contract. The Naval Facilities Engineering Command, I Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam, Hawaii, is the contracting activity.

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
