## H2B visa denial lawsuit continues in US District Court

Just as they were able to reach a settlement agreement, the federal lawsuit over the denial of H2B visas continues in US District Court.

In the latest filing, Plaintiffs Guam Contractors Association and about a dozen Guam businesses are asking the court to grant its motion for discovery beyond the administrative record. They're asking the Court to order the defendant, the Attorney General of the United States, to immediately produce the administrative record and all evidence related to guidance and policy concerning the issues of temporary need, peak load and one-time occurrence as part of the H2B visas.

While they've denied applications, USCIS says it's been based on the same set of operative facts and without any change in immigration laws or regulations. The plaintiffs would like any documents related to the denial to become part of the evidence.
