Judge sets date for H-2b denial matter

Federal Magistrate Judge Joaquin Manibusan has set a date to hear a motion for preliminary injunction in the Guam Contractors Association Case against the feds over the drastic denial of H-2b visas. Joining the GCA in the case is several local businesses impacted by the denial of the temporary work visas.

The plaintiffs have asked the District Court to immediately order the feds to reopen and grant their petitions, while the feds have objected to the motion calling it unjustified and premature because it will be filing a motion to dismiss the case by December 12.

Magistrate Judge Manibusan has set the hearing for December 22nd. Over the past year the approval of H-2b visas went from nearly 100% to zero.
