PUBLIC NOTICE
JOB POSTING REQUIREMENT FOR
TEMPORARY LABOR CERTIFICATIONS
October 24, 2019

BACKGROUND:

Employers who apply for a Temporary Labor Certification in association with a petition for H-2B workers on Guam must post their job opportunity on the Guam job bank at hireguam.com and advertise the job opportunity via a newspaper advertisement.

Federal Regulations at 8 CFR 214.2(h)(6)(V)(E)(2)(i) requires a petitioning employer to:
“Advertise the availability of the position for a minimum of three consecutive days in the newspaper with the largest daily circulation on Guam”

ANALYSIS OF DISTRIBUTION/CIRCULATION NUMBERS:

ALPCD has requested daily publication numbers from both newspapers of General Circulation.

Only one newspaper published their Statement of Ownership, Management and Circulation. The Guam Daily Post published their statement on October 10, 2019.

Inquiry was made through email and letter correspondence with the Pacific Daily News however no response was received.

According to available data, each publication's Average Daily Print Circulation for the preceding 12 months from October 2019 is as follows:

Pacific Daily News	Unknown - Unresponsive
Guam Daily Post	17,102

Based on the numbers available for consideration, the Department of Labor has determined that the **Guam Daily Post** is the newspaper of largest daily circulation in Guam for the purposes of Temporary Labor Certifications.

Employers who file applications for Temporary Labor Certifications **on or after October 25, 2019** must publish their 3 day advertisement in the Guam Daily Post to meet the requirements in 8 CFR 214.2 as stated above.

The Department will review circulation numbers again in October 2020 and will revisit this determination if necessary at that time.
